A scholarship for young people from a Black background

- Eligible applicants may apply for a scholarship of up to £2,700, paid according to an agreed schedule.
- Before making an application, please ensure you have read the full Terms and Conditions available at <http://kmi.open.ac.uk/scholarship>.
- Applications for the 2026 scholarship will close at midday on **30 April 2026**.
- Please note: Scholarship funds are limited. There are 3 scholarships available for 2026. Fulfilling the eligibility criteria does not guarantee you success. Awards will be made by a panel of OU staff, comprised of a Senior KMi academic, a KMi doctoral student, a People Services Representative and an Equality, Diversity & Inclusion Representative from the STEM Faculty.
- Eligible applicants will be invited to an interview in mid-May. Successful applicants will then be contacted by 1 June 2026.
